






Dear CONNECT Family,

Family Spiritual Practice

Faith Talk:

This past week has been a difficult one for many of us. For some, it brought moments of joy and affirmation, a deepening of beliefs; for others, it has been marked by grief and uncertainty over unwelcome changes. Whatever our individual experiences, it's clear that the next few months will be a season of transition—and transitions, as we know, bring change. Change is never easy; it's often challenging, sometimes painful, and it can leave us feeling like the ground beneath us has shifted. Yet, in the midst of this upheaval, change often clarifies



what truly matters to us, helping us redefine our priorities.

This week, I invite you to commit to simplifying your life every single day.

Sit down first thing in the morning and ask yourself, "How can I simplify my life today?"

- Do I need to purge and cleanse a physical area of my life?
- Maybe limit my to-do list? Cut an activity or two out of my schedule?
- Should I set limitations for myself (such as checking email, time spent working, etc.)?
- Do I need to say no to others so that I can feel less stress and produce better results?

Set a DAILY intention to keep things **extremely simple** this week and experience the inner peace and harmony that goes along with it.

HERE is a nice gratitude template that can be used. You can fill up your list as a family during one sitting, give each family member their own list to work on throughout the month—or really whatever works best for



you.

WHAT WE ARE WONDERING ABOUT

November Practice Theme: CONFESS!

We understand confession to be more about actions than simply words. Of course, words are a form of action, and confession certainly involves saying some key words, namely, those difficult and humbling words "I apologize" and "I'm sorry." But it also involves recognizing that we've done wrong, committing to finding another way to live, and repairing, to the best of our ability, any damage (physical or emotional) that has been done.

Last Sunday:

Last Sunday, we wondered about the Scripture passage of 1 Kings 8:54-61. In this passage, King Solomon prays a blessing over the people of Israel at the conclusion of the dedication of the temple of Jerusalem. They have followed God's instruction in constructing the temple, and God has been faithful to them. Solomon hopes that the people will continue in their obedience to God, encouraging them to "follow the life path" God has cleared for them. When do we follow God closely? In confession, we pause, look around, and realize our mistake.







This Sunday:

This Sunday, we will wonder together about the Scripture of Luke 15:11-32 - the Parable of the father and two sons, emphasizing the father's love for both sons (and thus, God's love for all of us). This Sunday, though, we will focus on the return of the prodigal son, the one who left home and strayed from God's path. In realizing his mistake, returning home, and apologizing, this wayward son finds his way back to God's path and serves as a model of repentance for children and adults alike.
